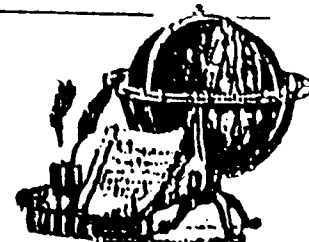

CONFEDERATE MONUMENT

The Black Horse Chapter of the United Daughters of the Confederacy of Warrenton, Virginia is attempting to raise \$80,000 to construct a monument listing the names of 520 Confederate soldiers buried in a mass grave in a cemetery there in Warrenton. There is a monument over the burial site at this time, but the Daughters want to build an addition that will have the names of the soldiers inscribed. The names of the soldiers were unknown until recently when Robert Smith of Illinois completed fourteen years of research. He began the work due to having ancestors in the Confederate Army.

The men were among 600 soldiers from ten states killed at the battles of First and Second Manassas. Wooden crosses bearing their names and made by Warrenton school children had originally been placed over their individual grave sites, however during the winter of 1863 Union soldiers used the crosses for firewood, leaving the graves unmarked. The Confederate dead were later collected from their individual graves and reburied at the current location.

A list of South Carolinians buried at the site is included with this newsletter.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF SIX AND TWENTY BAPTIST CHURCH

May 16, 1835, one hundred thirty-three years ago, Six and Twenty Baptist Church was constituted. The following are names of the seventeen charter members of the church.

The presbytery officiating in the organization of the church stated that they had found the above seventeen members had been dismissed from Baptist churches in order for them to organize the new church, found them orthodox in the faith, constituted them into a regular Baptist Church and clothed them with power to any act that is right and lawful for any Christian church to do. Signing for the presbytery were: Matthew Gambrell, Pastor of Dorchester church, W. M. Pickle and Simeon Smith, deacons of the Pisgah church.

The first pastory, Rev. D. Timmons, was called January 1836. The second pastor, J. J. Wilson was ordained by the church May 20, 1843 and called as pastor June 1843. He served as pastor twenty-one years. Below is a complete list of pastors.

They served well, "Giving full proof of their ministry".

The church has engaged in several building programs since first organized in 1835. A committee composed of J. E. Pickle, Michael Melton, W. M. Richey, Thomas Harper, and J. J. Wilson was elected to lead in a new house of worship. Later in June of 1853 Jacob Martin deeded two acres of land to the church and Wm. Pickle, J. J. Wilson, J. M. Welborn, Wm. Martin, and Cyrus Hamelton were elected trustees of church property.

Plans were made in February 1883 for a new church building and the building was completed and dedicated in August that year. One year later, March 29, 1884, a cyclone destroyed the new church. The same year, however, a new church was constructed. The church met in an old house at the spring while the new building was being completed.

Other buildings were completed and dedicated in April 1902. E. M. Stone, S. J. Newton, D. R. Melton, J. M. Garrett, J. H. Melton and A. W. Pickens composed the building committee.

The church was also rebuilt in 1920 and additional Sunday School rooms added in 1922. The last building was completed, as it now stands, in 1959. Ray A. Grant was pastor. The committee leading in the building was: C. T. Mullikin, W. F. Sanders and R. F. Mullikin.

The present pastorium, a beautiful spacious building, was completed in December 1966. Rev. Virgil A. Merck, pastor, and the men of the church did most of the work. The \$25,000.00 house was completed with only about a \$6,000.00 debt left. The pastorium is situated on a beautiful lot contributed by Mr. Benjamin Martin, *+ Furman Martin.*

In October 1867 after the "War Between the States" the church granted letters to its Negro members so they could organize a church for themselves. Michael Melton gave them some land and on it they built a house of worship. Mount Able Church is now on the property.

Six and Twenty has great promise. It is complete with all the organizations. The trend of young people and adults moving to the cities for employment because of the decline in agriculture is being reversed. Good roads and convenient transportation with all the modern conveniences to be had in country homes is attracting more people into the community. More people will continue to build here and live away from the busy bulging cities.

"And they continued steadfastly in the apostles' doctrine, and fellowship, and in the breaking of bread and in prayers". Acts 2:42.

This verse conveys our hope and purpose for continuing as a church. Continual obedience to God's word will make bright the life of any church.
