March Abbreviated Minutes: The Anderson County Chapter of the SC Genealogical Society met at the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints on March 3, 2003, with 22 members present. The president, Juanita Garrison, opened the meeting and announced that we would have the program first. Gene Schneider introduced the speaker, Shirley McElhannon, Administrator of Anderson County's Register of Deeds office.

Ms. McElhannon told us that the office processes 5,000 documents a month . There is a staff of ten, which deals with all documents establishing property ownership - deeds, mechanics' liens, timber deeds, rights of way, easements, and plats. They assist many people who wish to do research and will provide certified true copies of original documents, such as wills, at a cost of \$.50 a page. Turnaround time is now two days; formerly, it was ten. The earliest deed books are in the State Archives in Columbia, but the Anderson office has indexes to them. Records date back to the 1700's.

Cindy Chandler, a new chapter member, is the coordinator of the Anderson County website. She puts newspaper obituaries, wills, etc. on line. The new web address is <u>www.rootsweb.com/~scander 2.</u><

Lamar Gamble gave the invocation. The chapter now has 89 paid members. Linda Cushing asked that someone write a page for the Carolina Herald for this quarter. Several topics were suggested, and Juanita Garrison offered to write about the Denver community. Updated genealogy sheets were submitted for the pedigree sheets.

Gene Schneider brought material relating to tax exempt status for study.

Carl Ellison suggested buying a computer for genealogy use for the library. He, Cindy Chandler, and John Allen Morris will talk to the library staff about this and check on costs.

Entries for the state's book contest have been submitted. The judging will be in June and awards will be given in July. Our entries were Debbie Harbin's <u>Mountain Creek Minutes</u> and Sue Brewer's <u>McDougald-Johnston Mortuary Index.</u>

The classes for beginners in genealogy research will be held on the first and third Tuesdays in May from 7-9 p.m. in the conference room at the library, and taught by Jim Harper. There will be a \$10 charge for materials. This will be publicized once next week and again just before they begin. Jim Harper has published three volumes of "The Intelligencer", an early Anderson newspaper and they are for sale at \$23 each. Contact him if you want one.

Lamar Gamble asked that people copy Bible records and send them to him or John Allen Morris. Included should be the name of the sender, a copy of the frontispiece with date of publication, name of Bible's owner, address and phone number, plus the family name.

Plans are to proceed on obtaining a computer for the SC room at the Anderson Library. A proposal describing what we want will be presented to Mr. Carl Stone.

Dr. Ellison then presented the program. He distributed various forms and described their use. He advised that one keep a research sheet so that you'll know what you've done and what you're working on. Keep detailed notes. Use ready to use forms.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

USING THE CHARLESTON LIBRARY'S WEB SITE

This is a case of do as I say, not as I do! You can prepare yourself for a trip to the South Carolina Room at the main Charleston County Public Library with judicious use of the library's web site. You can save time and effort for the days when you actually visit the library to do your genealogical research.

First go to the library's home page address at http://www.ccpl.org/. Scroll down the page until you see "Library Services" on the left. Under that heading, you will see "SC History / Genealogy." Place your mouse on that line and left-click it to go to a web page with lots of information on the South Carolina Room (http://www.ccpl.org/scr.html).

Scroll down to "Guidelines to South Carolina Room Research" and left-click your mouse on that line to jump to that part of the web page. Here you will see general procedures to use in the South Carolina Room. Further down the same web page is a Genealogy Bibliography, which lists some of the sources in the South Carolina Room. Under the category "Guides to South Carolina Genealogy", several books are listed along with the Dewey Decimal System number. One example is *The Genealogist's Guide to Charleston County, South Carolina*, SCR 929 Coté. Another work listed here is *African American Genealogical Research*, SCR 929.30973 Begle.

The next category is "General Works", which includes *Index of Surnames, South Carolina Gazette*, 1832-1751 [sic] SCR 071.57 Index. Another reference listed here is *South Carolina Magazine of Ancestral Research*, SCR 929.1 Canno. Look further down the screen under Record of Marriages for Charleston, SC, and you will find a variety of resources, from books to microfilm and microfiche and CD-ROM. Examples are *South Carolina Lowcountry Church Records* on microfiche and Family Tree Maker Marriage Index: AL, GA, SC, 1641 - 1944 on CD-ROM.

Other categories of works are Birth, Marriage, and Death Records for Charleston, SC; Wills; Immigration; Land and Tax Records; Military Records even before the Revolutionary War; Directories including those for the City of Charleston as early as 1782 on microfilm; and federal census records for South Carolina on microfilm. Please do browse the web site to see the many works available in these different categories.

When you do visit the South Carolina Room, the librarians there will help you find books, noccounts and microfiche, various indexes in that room, and even death cards in file drawers.

Have you thought about using old newspapers? You might read them to find traces of your elusive ancestors to get past brick walls. The South Carolina Room has limited space to store microfilms of newspapers, but you may want to visit the Periodicals Department at the back of the second floor.

How do you find out if the library has the newspaper that you want to read? According to a librarian at the Ask-A-Question web page (http://www.ccpl.org/askaq.html), you can search the online catalog for a newspaper using a Title search. If the library has any issues of that newspaper, your search results will list the years/issues. The old newspapers will be on microfilm.

To search the web site for old newspapers, first return to the library's home page at http://www.ccpl.org/ by clicking the Back button. Look for the heading "Library Catalog Information" on the left side of the screen. Move your mouse to "Search the library's catalog" and left-click that line. On the next screen left-click the button labeled "Search by title". The next web page title is "Search the Charleston County Library's Catalog by Title". That page has a search box where you can type in the name of the newspaper you are seeking. Left-click your mouse in the search box and type in, for example, "gazette" (without the quotation marks). Left-click the small down arrow to the right of "Type of materials" to specify "as serials only" so you do not search for books about newspapers. You might also want to click on the small down arrow to the right of "Language:" and specify "eng English only". You really didn't want to read all about it in Arabic or Cantonese, did you?

Now left-click your mouse on the "Begin Title Search" button. For "gazette" the search function returns three titles with hyperlinks (a hyperlink is an area of the screen where you can click your mouse to go to a different web page). The first hyperlink displays "Gazette (3 titles)". If you click on that title/hyperlink you are taken to another web page that lists 3 different Gazettes. One looks interesting, since it is *old*. It is "The gazette of the State of South Carolina - [microform]. Charleston, S.C.: Timothy and Boden [etc.], 1777-1785. Below that information, the listing indicates that the location of the newspaper is MAIN - Periodicals Room and Microfilm (1777 - 1782). If you click on the title just listed, the hyperlink will take you to more details about the microfilmed newspaper.

If you browse the library's web site from home, and make notes of the books, microfilms, or other resources that interest you, your next trip to the South Carolina Room can be more productive.

"I just uncovered Rev. Basil Smith's wife's maiden name, which has been a mystery for a lot of Smith researchers. I was looking over William Slaton's estate file and discovered where Basil Smith signed for some money coming from the estate of George Slaton. The administrator of William Slaton's estate had been appointed Basil's Power of Attorney to collect this for him. I had supposed that George Slaton went to GA or TN, but I found him listed as having an estate settlement in Jackson County, GA around 1837. Basil Smith was listed as having a voucher in the settlement.

In family history listed under www.Genealogy.com, they showed George Slaton having a daughter, Milly b.1800 married to a Boyd Smith. This is incorrect. Amelia (Milly) was born in 1773 in VA and married Basil Smith, who was born in 1772 in GA. William Slaton was a brother to Amelia. One of Basil's sons, Phillip Porter Smith, married a daughter of William Slaton, Jane Slaton. Caleb Cartee married Elizabeth, another daughter of William Slaton.

Based on this information, I believe my ancestor, George S. Smith, son of Basil and Milly, was named after George Slaton. The S in his middle name stands for Slaton. Phillip Porter Smith's son, William S. Smith, probably had the same middle name, Slaton.

Another interesting note is that George Slaton had property around 1790 on both sides of Little Beaverdam Creek and Joseph Smith had land grants on the upper end of Big Beaverdam Creek. This makes me more convinced that Basil was the son of Joseph and Elizabeth Smith.

If anyone has or acquires copies of George Slaton's estate settlement, I would love to have a copy." Tom

John Liddell son of Andrew Liddell to have 250 acres out of a 1000 acre tract near Lexington KY know by the name of Namchester Spring, Jerrett Liddell son of Andrew Liddell to have 250 acres out of same tract, remainder of that land sold and divided among remainder of Andrew Liddell's children and Moses Liddell's children. Land lying at the Falls of Ohip 3 miles square except a part where a town stands known by the name of Clarkesville, 300 arising from that sale to William Liddell, son of John Liddell, Remainder divided among children of Andrew and Moses Liddell. To William Liddell son of John Liddell 320 acres on Duck River in Cumberland (NC or VA?) Moses Liddell son of Moses to have horse, saddle and bridle. Tools divided between Moses and William Liddell. Dated 20 Feb 1798 wit: John Simpson, Elijah Nicholson, Alexander Young. Prov 16 April 1798

In 1790 he settled in Pendleton District at the place on which he died..left 6 sons, 3 dtrs 72 grandchildren, and 35 g-great grandchildren..member of the Presbyterian Church.

Will of Andrew Liddell Sr...wife Jane calles herself Jenney Liddel to whom I was married and who lived with me about 4 years and who then voluntarily left my house, bed and boarding and hath not returned any more to me nor been in my house for wpwards of 10 years and on this account I give her one cow to her and her heirs and assigns forever. To my oldest son John 110 acres joining land of my own and Andrew Liddell Jr on Twenty Six Mile Creek. Son Andrew J. Liddle Esq land whereon he now lives, being 100 acres. To son George land where on he now lives 100 acres also to son George a negro girl or female slave named Tabb about 25 or 40 years of age. To son Moses Liddle \$10.00 to be paid by son James S. Liddle to son France \$30.00. \$20.00 to be paid by my son George and rest by son James S. to my dtrs Jean Mauldin widow of Joab Mauldin. Elizabeth Miller the wife of John Miller and Mary McGehee wife of Willes McGee each \$10.00 in addition to what I have already given them namely one negro shortly after marriage. To son James S. the land I now live on and a negro

boy Jack aged 4 and negro Jeffry aged 6 months. Exors son James S. Dated 25 Jan 1820. wit: John Harris, Joseph Grisham, Wm Grisham.

Codicil: I have been long afflicted and my son James S has been at great trouble with me. I revoke bequest to son Frances except the \$20.00 to be paid him by son George. Dated Oct 1832. Wit: John B. Ealry Jr, Randolph Brown, C. Gaillard. Prov 6 May 1833.

Andrew Liddel granted 400 acres on Six and Twenty Mile a branch of Savannah River as a citizen surveyed by David Hopkins DS. Rec. 11 June 1784.
